Job Market Paper: "Understanding changes over time in the receipt of workers' compensation benefits"

Workers' compensation, the oldest social insurance program in the United States, continues to serve as an important safety net for the vast majority of the workforce. The program supports workers at a particularly vulnerable time: immediately after suffering an occupational injury or illness. Yet, despite this vital role, less is known about the program's long-term trends. To understand these trends, I systematically investigated the reasons for the 43.6 percent decrease in the recipiency rate of cash benefits over the period from 2003 through 2018. I find that 68 percent of this decrease—29.5 percentage points—can be explained by improvements to workplace safety within industry sectors.
